Doors open at 8:35 – Late bell is 8:50 Dismissal begins at 3:35

Arrival & Dismissal Procedures Arrival:

- Preschool and Prek will enter through the first set of double doors in the bus loop
- Kindergarten walkers should be walked to the outside classroom door. They must be escorted to the door by an adult
- Kindergarten Bus Riders will enter through the first set of double doors in the bus loop
- 1st, 2nd, 5th grade walkers and bus riders enter through the main doors
- 3rd and 4th grade walkers and bus riders will enter through doors to the left of the gym

Dismissal:

- Preschool, PreK, Kindergarten walkers will be picked up at the outside classroom doors
- 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grade will exit the building by the side door on Leefield Ave.
- Bus riders will exit through the front door when their bus is called

Screening & Testing (Safety is Our True North)

- All families should screen students for symptoms prior to leaving home.
- Please use this <u>checklist</u> to determine if a student should or should not go to school.
- Persons with COVID-19 symptoms in school will be required to be tested or will be placed on quarantine, in alignment with guidance from the Maryland Department of Health.

Face Covering (<u>Safety is Our True North</u>) Requirements:

All persons, regardless of vaccination status, must wear a face covering while inside a school. Exceptions to this requirement are:

- The person is alone in a private space.
- The person is eating or drinking.
- The person has a documented physical or developmental disability that makes wearing a mask unsafe.
- The person is under the age of two.
- The person is a student athlete engaged in the sport in the field of play.

Social Distancing (Safety is Our True North)

Requirements: Physical distancing of students from each other and between students and adults will be provided to the greatest extent possible, considering school enrollment and facility constraints. Strategies include:

- Use of classroom and cafeteria configurations that provide maximal separation between students.
- Plans for arrival, dismissal and change of classes to reduce gathering of students in any area.
- Restriction of field trips to day trips only, with plans to reduce exposure to large crowds.
- Plans for supervision of restrooms, locker rooms, and school lockers to prevent congregation of students.

Hand Hygiene (Safety is Our True North)

Requirements: Employees and students have been instructed to adhere to best practices in hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette.

Times for handwashing or use of hand sanitizer to include before and after meals, upon arrival to schools' offices and home, before and after use of any shared items, after use of the restroom, after sneezing/coughing and other time hands are contaminated.

Breakfast & Lunch

Breakfast will be grab and go as students enter the building.

Lunch will be free to all students and students will eat in the cafeteria

Students will be required to put masks on once they are finished eating

Students will have assigned seating for the purpose of contact tracing

At this time there will not be an option to buy snacks



Supplies & Devices:

- Devices will be provided for each student
- Device bags will be provided while supplies last
- Device can be taken home depending on assignments and grade level. Classroom teachers will share information at Back-to-School Night

Visitors (Safety is Our True North)

- To visit a BCPS school, visitors must have an appointment.
- Visits will be conducted remotely or outside, whenever possible.
- If an indoor visit is required, visitors will be required to wear a face coverings and practice social distancing.
- The number of people admitted to the building will be limited.
